Count me in for Easter!

One of the most significant weeks of the Christian calendar, Holy Week, is upon us. This is the week that we walk with Jesus on His journey to the cross and the empty tomb. For Christ followers, the resurrection is the central reason for the hope and faith we have in the Lord, our God. If Jesus were not raised from the dead, then none of what we believe and practice would mean a thing. Everything in our Christian faith rides on the resurrection victory of Jesus. Thank you Lord!

As a church, we go "All in" during Holy Week. We will start on Palm Sunday (March 28th) with a Palm Sunday worship celebration at 6:00 PM. This event will be put together by members of our socially distanced worship choir. In doing so, we remember Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Keep an eye out for the "Drive Through" Easter Egg Hunt that will be held throughout the week. On Maundy Thursday, we remember the New Passover meal known as the Lord's Supper, as Jesus washed feet, broke bread, and shared the cup with the disciples. These actions would have broken from the traditional Jewish Passover meal and were a sign of God's New Covenant for us all. On Good Friday, we will worship at 7:00 PM, as we somberly reflect on the suffering of Christ and what He went through in order to save us. Of course, the culminating moment will be Easter Sunday, April 4th, as we celebrate the risen Christ in three worship services (8:15 AM Traditional, 10 AM & 11:30 AM Contemporary). This is the Sunday of all Sundays as we celebrate God's victory over sin, hell, and death—raising us up to new life with Jesus. Praise God!

What a wonderfully fruitful week this will be! All of this is made possible because there are people in Rolling Plains Church that say "Count me in" with their time, talents, and treasures to further the Kingdom of God through the work of God's Church. The question is, are you all in? The Sunday after Easter (April 11th) we will be starting a new sermon series called, "Count me in!" The focus of this series will be to encourage each and every person connected to our congregation to be all in, on coming as you are, and planting deep roots into God, and His Church. We will help people realize that each of us is invaluable to God's Kingdom work through His Church. People will also be reminded that each of us has tremendous influence for the body of Christ. As Kingdom influencers we are also called to be Kingdom Investors through generosity. It will be a great series—helping each of us take the next step of being "all in" with God through his local church at Rolling Plains.

Let's not wait until April 11th to be all in for Jesus and His Church. Holy week is a great chance to start. Whom do we know that we can invite to come as they are with us into God's family? Let's share with people our deep roots and love for God and His Church. Let people see that you are "all in". When we come as we are to God's family and church, let's not come alone. This can be done if you are attending live and in-person, or if you are worshiping digitally. Invite someone to share in worship (however you do it) with us. Are we so "all in" with God that we

proclaim "I love my Church" everywhere we go? Are we so blessed by God's love, grace, and mercy that we are desperate for others to share in our family of God with us? Easter is such a great opportunity to invite people in our life to come as they are. Tell people they are invited! People are more willing to come when they are invited by someone personally.

Perhaps we have been disconnected and feeling distant from God and His Church. Maybe we've gotten out of the habit of worshipping, serving, giving, praying, being in the Word, or in Christian fellowship with each other. Will you say to God and His Church "Count me in"? Let's be "all in" knowing we are invaluable to the rest of the body. Each of us has a different gift, skill set, and can fulfill a different role. When we aren't engaged with our church or our gifts aren't being deployed for God, our church is less than it could be because of it. Let's be "all in" as a person of influence that God can use to positively influence the body of Christ and the family of God. Each of us has the capacity to be an influencer for God's purpose in helping others find Christ, and to grow in their faith. Let's be "all in" as God's Kingdom Investors through His local Church—knowing that God's design is to supply all that His local Church needs through His followers. We are all blessed to be a blessing! Let me ask you again. This Easter, can we count on each other to be "all in"? Let's take advantage of every opportunity to Come as we are, Connect with God and others, Grow in God's Word and prayer, and Go—in Jesus' name and help others find Him. You can count me in! How about you?






Road to Recovery Ministry faithfully visits inmates in the Muskingum County Jail to offer hope and pathways for healing.


The LIFE RECOVERY BIBLE has been a powerful tool used to lead inmates to the source of true healing, God in Jesus Christ.
