God's Plan

In last month's newsletter, we named the reality that often we have plans that don't go as planned. The good news is that God's purpose always prevails, even when things seem to be falling apart around us. In fact, that is the Gospel message, the Good News of Jesus Christ. God brought His creation (you and me) into being to bring Glory to Himself. He created us to love us and to have a personal relationship with us. He created us as the object of His desire—to share all His goodness and the vast blessings of His Kingdom with us. By us loving God back and serving Him with our whole life, it brings Him Glory. This is His plan.

However, humanity turned away from the beauty and innocence of all God had for them in the Garden of Eden, allowing temptation to overcome them with a feeling that God was holding out on them. They chose to partake in what God had forbidden, causing them to hide from God. Thus, a fracture in the relationship between God and His creation came into being, known as sin. Ever since the garden, humanity has been running from God—making our own plans, doing our own thing, living how we want, and hiding from God. Ever since the garden, God has not let go of His love for His creation and has been in pursuit of reconciling us to Himself. This is a story played out over and over in the Old Testament. Humanity runs from God, but in His prevailing purposes of love, He won't let them go.

Enter Jesus. Jesus came to this earth not only to save us and pay the penalty for our sins, but He came to bring Glory to the Father—fulfilling His purposes. Holy Week and Easter Sunday are the consummate reminders that God was never going to let you go, let you run off and do your own thing, or live life how you think is best. No, God has a plan for you. He has an incredible, abundant life that is a better way to live than we could ever ask for, imagine, or plan on our own. That abundant life is to follow His purposes. Jesus came to get us back on track, to pay the penalty for our sin, and bring us back into alignment with God. It was God's plan.

But it was the LORD's good plan to crush him and cause him grief. Yet when his life is made an offering for sin, he will have many descendants. He will enjoy a long life, and the LORD's good plan will prosper in his hands.

-Isaiah 53:10

Let me encourage you as we approach Holy Week and Easter Sunday, to lay down your plans. Let's lay down our preconceived notions of how God should operate. Let's humble ourselves and ask some deeper, probing questions. Where in your life are you running from God? What area of your life is keeping you from God? What sin (habit, attitude, action, thought) in your life is keeping you from deeper fellowship and intimacy with God? Open your heart to God. Give Him full access. Ask the Holy Spirit to search you for anything that does not honor Him, and then let God go to work in you in a brand-new way.

While there is no condemnation in Christ, let Godly conviction fall all over you as we journey to the cross of Christ together through Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday. Then, let's celebrate God's pursuit, His incredible love for us, His humble sacrifice, and His ultimate power over sin, hell, and death that culminates with the resurrection of Christ. Easter Sunday celebrates God's victory over the brokenness and death of innocence in the Garden of Eden. Jesus raised from the dead secures a lifetime of love with God for all of eternity. Let's lean into this season of Easter—the fulfillment of God's prevailing purpose over humanity's broken plans.

Lastly, who do you know that could be blessed by the incredible purposes of God, that you could invite and bring with you to the multitude of opportunities we have at Rolling Plains throughout Holy Week? Keep in mind everyone experiences broken plans. Everyone needs God's greater purposes in their life. Most people are more eager to come to church than we are to ask.



Hello All!

I hope you are all doing well and enjoying the random sunshine and good weather. I am excited to bring you all the updates happening at Bethel Community Center.

Our monthly food box event was held on Saturday, January 20, 2024. We served our 30 boxes to families within the first 20 minutes of the event. It seems we have many in need of our food boxes with the rising costs of rent and groceries. Our newest Board member, Barbie Welker, and her husband helped at this event. We are so grateful to our Board members and volunteers who have stepped up and helped with the monthly food box giveaway. It is very rewarding and enlightening to see the process first hand.

Our After-School Program has been serving approximately 8 to 10 kids daily. We currently have many community partners coming into the center to help bring diversity to our programming. Regular visits from the Muskingum County Literacy Council, The Ohio State University Extension Office, the YMCA's "Y on the Fly" Program, Karen Linser (a volunteer who shares a Bible lesson and craft monthly), and GoodCity Creatives all have contributed to the success of our After-School Program. Kathy Campbell, the Program Coordinator for Bethel, has incorporated "Bethel Bucks" to reward the children for good behavior and kindness. The children may spend their "Bethel Bucks" earned on a variety of prizes we have accumulated at the center from local partners, staff, and volunteers. This has proven to be a great learning incentive.

January has been a prosperous month for our new rental service. Bethel Community Center has rented the center out for birthday parties, craft parties, and even a baby shower, all in the month of January! We are very pleased with the results. All of our guests have been exceptional at keeping the center clean, and we could not be happier.



The prayer ministry would like to thank everyone who joined our Rolling Plains family in praying and fasting during the month of January. It is our prayer that each one of you gained insight into the power and presence of God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. I found an immense peace and comfort in creating a habit of spending intentional time with God when I woke up and before I went to bed. This is a practice I found so vital that I have committed to continuing it until God calls me to change it. I will also continue a significant reduction in the time I spend on social media. I have found social media to be a significant time warp that keeps me from doing things that could honor God and my family. That does not mean I am perfect at this practice, but I will continue to try to grow in it because I know it honors God. I hope that each of you has found a closeness to God and growth in spirituality that you don't want to let go of. If not, it is never too late to start.

With that in mind, we are already in the season of Lent. According to the Catholic church: "Lent is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting and almsgiving (service) that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter." During this time, the prayer ministry encourages you to continue your walk in growing closer to God by praying for His wisdom, fasting from things of this world that hinder your relationship with God; and giving of your time, talents, or provisions. Please let us know if there is any way we can support you.

One way the prayer ministry has encouraged and supported Rolling Plains during Holy week is to present The JOURNEY TO THE CROSS. This year it is on Monday, March 25th at 6:30 PM in the Worship Center. We are praising God that people are coming out to experience the transforming grace of God through the ministry's presentation. Each year we evaluate the experience and feedback to try to make your experience more impactful the following year. This year we decided to eliminate the wait time. Please arrive by 6:30 pm and find a seat in the sanctuary so we may begin on time. Pastor John will be starting off the Journey by presenting the Last Supper and offering communion to each guest. Prayer Ministry members will depict the experience of Jesus and the people around Him as He took our sins to the cross, died, and rose again to save us. Pat Wiseman-Jones will conclude the Journey with the empty tomb. She will anoint and pray over each guest who comes forward for that experience.


We are looking forward to sharing this experience with our community, so please invite your friends and family to join you for The Journey to the Cross and the many experiences of Holy week at Rolling Plains.

As I write this, more than 11 million Operation Christmas Child shoebox gifts are just beginning their journey—crossing oceans, mountains, and deserts—to delight children in more than 100 countries around the world. We thank God for everyone who prayerfully packed these gifts, and we praise Him for using each box to His glory.

TO THE ENDS OF THE EARTH: In parts of Suriname accessible only by canoe, teachers led *The Greatest Journey* lessons after our church partners handed out shoebox gifts. A class from Ecuador is shown above. But as these children receive their gifts, another journey is about to begin. In the coming year, many of them will be enrolling in *The Greatest Journey*—our discipleship classes designed especially for children who have just received Operation Christmas Child shoebox gifts.

Over the past 30 years, more than 50 million children have been reached through these discipleship lessons, including 25 million who have prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Samaritan's Purse trains volunteer teachers and provides materials in 91 languages. We also provide a New Testament for each child who completes the course. So far, over 36 million New Testaments have been given to graduates through our local church partners. Join us in asking God to raise up an army of young evangelists who are prepared and eager to share the Gospel with their friends and family members.
