In Chapter One of James we looked at the trials of our faith in the light of the faithfulness of our God. We were encouraged to endure our trials with the knowledge that trials actually strengthen our faith.

Likewise, we were admonished to not only be 'hearers' of God's Word, but to also be 'doers' of the Word with respect to our behaviors.

Chapter two continues along the theme of "being doers of God's Word" – adding action to our profession of faith.

THE LAW OF LOVE

As Christians, we are called to live our lives in a way that pleases God. We are called to a life of obedience. When Jesus' disciples asked him what was the greatest commandment, Jesus responded with these Words of Truth:

36 "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the law?" 37 Jesus said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' 38 This is the first and great commandment. 39 And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' 40 On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets." Matthew 22:36-40 (NKJV)

READ JAMES 2:14-26 FAITH AND WORKS

Living a life of LOVE through faith **(BELIEF)** in Jesus Christ calls the believer beyond their profession of faith to a demonstration of love in action **(WORKS).**

James asks a crucial question in verse 14 concerning faith (BELIEF) and action (WORKS). Can faith without a demonstration of that faith save you?

• Consider the following verse from Romans 10:9 concerning Salvation:

"If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved."

• Salvation requires both faith (BELIEF) and action (CONFESSION).

Likewise, a life of faith always has corresponding action(s).

We don't do works of faith in order to be saved, but we engage in faithful works because we are saved.

Our actions/works are therefore a witness to our faith, and James says that these two, FAITH and WORKS testify of our faith.
